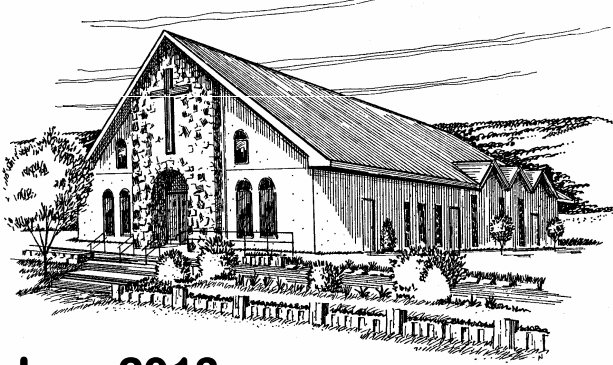

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Many hands make light work!

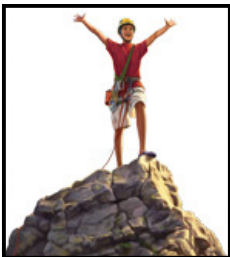
Nearly every job in our church is done by a

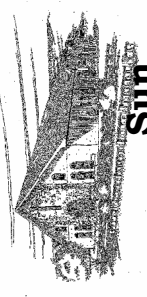
Tell It on the Mountain VBS will take us on an expedition to the top of five mountains and teach you more about God's might and grace and His Son, Jesus our Savior and Lord.

The church is in the process of hiring a new attendant.

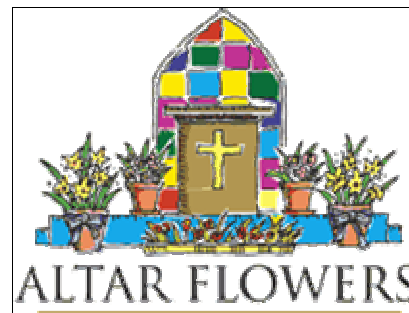


Men's Prayer Breakfast

Goal: To share God's Word from The Bible and the Gospel of Jesus Christ in new outreaches and to strengthen believers in those outreaches in order to build up the body of Christ to the glory of God. Our primary focus is starting a new Lutheran Church near East Central Ave. in ABQ. because starting new churches is the most successful evangelism method.

Getting Involved: We all know the parable of the Good Samaritan which emphasizes our showing mercy, which is also an emphasis of our Rocky Mountain District and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. But this parable can be applied to helping others spiritually as much as helping them physically. You can help us with your prayers, service, and financial gifts. Or you can walk by on the other side of the road. Jesus has saved our souls by His grace. What a gift that we can now share the Good News of Jesus with others! Please help us in this task, or if others are serving in evangelism or missions in a better way, then help them! But how can we who are God's chosen people ignore those who do not know Him? One simple way you can get involved is to come to the Circuit Forum Sunday June 23 at 4pm at Immanuel Lutheran on 300 Gold SE in ABQ and vote for District Funds to be given to the new church we are developing, Love of God Lutheran Church. You might ask, "Why should I care about others who are lost?" Here's another question to think about, "Why did God care about me?"

How you can help: Gather school supplies for children in Juarez, Mexico, deadline is July 17. Wal-mart has school supplies on sale after July 4, that's a great time to buy! This year instead of collecting toys we will collect sports equipment to give to the Mexican churches plus our usual school and art supplies, baby blankets, toothpaste and toothbrushes. We need hundreds of items so please get the best price so you can give more!

Other areas of ministry: Please pray for these ministries to grow: our Back To Work program, our street evangelism, Food bank, our Thursday Spanish and English Bible Study, youth group, Friday Bible study at the IHOP on Central and Eubank, Sunday services at Brookdale Place at Tramway and Manitoba, online suicide prevention ministry, July Mexico Missions trip, and monthly Celebrate Jesus service at 126 Pennsylvania.
